### STORIES OF SUCCESS

### **GENNESARET FREE CLINIC**

John was admitted to Gennesaret Free Clinic's Housing Recovery Program (HRP) from the burn unit at Eskenazi Hospital. He had severe frostbite and had lost several of his toes. John had been living outside since the age of 18. He rarely stayed in shelters, as he did not like interacting with others. What most impressed all of the HRP staff was John's intelligence. His mind was sharp and logical; he retained facts and observations in an amazing way, and he had an extensive vocabulary. He settled into the HRP, but at first remained isolated. As he began to feel more comfortable, he soon began interacting with staff and other residents. After many weeks, John began to build bonds with those around him. As he healed, John started to think that maybe living in his own place after 26 years on the street might be the best thing. His stay at the HRP was the longest time he had lived in a home-like environment and the closest he had allowed others into his life in many years. After 10 years of trying to get him off the street and into housing; he is now living in his own apartment with supportive services.

#### PATHWAY TO RECOVERY

Jerry T. had been living outside at one of the homeless camps on White River for years. He had a severe alcohol problem and had given up on ever having any kind of productive life. He asked an outreach worker for help on December 22, 2013 and the outreach worker brought him to Pathway. Jerry was intoxicated and crying. He was embarrassed and ashamed of his situation. He said he didn't want to take up a bed at Pathway and prevent someone "more deserving" from having it. He also said there wouldn't be anyone to take care of his campmate who was physically disabled and unable to carry firewood to keep a fire going to stay warm. His last worry was that no one would feed his 15 cats. The outreach worker agreed to check on the disabled man daily to make sure he was warm and to feed the cats. As a result, Jerry agreed to give Pathway a try. The outreach workers that knew him had been trying to get him off the streets for years because he was a hard worker with a caring heart. He just couldn't overcome his alcoholism. Jerry agreed to give Pathway a try on a trial basis and he has been clean and sober ever since. He began working fulltime on a construction crew in February, managed by a former Pathway graduate with long-term recovery. He received his 6 month sobriety token on June 23, 2014 and he has been paying his own rent for several months. In July, Jerry graduated to Pathway-III, the semi-independent living program for men preparing for long-term permanent housing and is already planning for his next move which will be to his own apartment.
