Our History

Founded in 1984 by MIBOR REALTOR* Association and operating as its charitable arm, the REALTOR* Foundation provides REALTORS* the opportunity to make a difference by supporting the people, projects and services that shape the quality of their community.

Since its founding, the REALTOR® Foundation has awarded grants that have helped central Indiana strengthen its environment.

In 2003, the REALTOR® Foundation announced its new mission to assist in fighting the serious problem of homelessness in our area. The Foundation made a long-term commitment to working with organizations in and around central Indiana that reach out to victims who have lost their homes due to domestic violence, natural disaster, job loss and other tragedies. Our focus is on breaking the cycle of emergency shelters and homelessness, putting victims on the path to stability. Under this new mission, the Foundation has granted more than \$2,000,000 to local homeless service providers.

Unlocking Doors of Hope for Families

In our community, homelessness disproportionally effects families. Families are the fastest growing segment of the homeless population in Indiana. Last year more than 3,500 kids in Marion County were identified as homeless by their school. 4 out of 10 homeless adults on any given night – have children with them. The average age of a homeless person is just 7 years old. This is why the REALTOR® Foundation invests a third of our grant dollars in programs who are most effective at keeping families together and walking along side them on a path to independence.

Alyson's Story

Alyson and her four young girls came to Family Promise of Hendricks County after the father of her children was incarcerated. She couldn't afford to live on her own but was determined to seek the resources she needed to become self-sufficient in order to give her girls the best life possible.

When she arrived at the shelter she had goals to become a certified home healthcare aid, buy her own car, find affordable health care and eventually move into her own home. With the help of Family Promise of Hendricks County, Alyson was able to meet all of these goals and more in just 92 days!

She is now living in a 4-bedroom apartment where she can comfortably afford her rent and utilities.

During her last week with Family Promise, Alyson's 8-year-old daughter drew a picture that perfectly describes the mission of Family Promise: Creating stepping stones for families in the community moving from homelessness to sustainable housing.



Unlocking Doors of Hope for Victims of Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is the leading cause of homelessness for women and children in central Indiana. The Indiana Domestic Violence Network reported 22,758 crisis calls in 2015 and 88% of callers were seeking shelter. Often times a domestic violence shelter is also one of the only shelter resources in rural communities. The REALTOR® Foundation believes in investing in safe havens where victims can heal and overcome in a safe and supportive environment.

Ava's Story

Ava was born and raised in a Caribbean country. She was first victimized at the age of 14 and spent 20 years married to an abusive man. She was freed from abuse when her husband died. A while later she was introduced to a man in our community through a mutual friend. Ava came to the United States to meet this man. He promised her a life full of love and support – and for a while he kept this promise. Soon the two were married and Ava moved here to be with him.

She came to shelter at Alternatives Inc. determined to create positive changs in her life. Her short-term goals were to find employment and maintain her immigration status. Her husband had not allowed her to be employed and despite all the pain she had endured, she wanted to remain in the United States. Ava actively participated in groups and case management. She took advantage of every learning opportunity provided her.

After a while, Ava secured a job she enjoyed and was able to begin saving money for a safe and secure home. Alternatives Inc., through a grant from the REALTOR* Foundation, was able to be the support and assistance she needed as she achieved her goals and dreams.



Unlocking Doors of Hope for Our Cities Most Vulnerable

The issue of homelessness is complicated, and any number of reasons can lead someone there. Those experiencing homelessness in central Indiana come from all walks of life and have a diverse range of barriers they are working to overcome. The REALTOR* Foundation aims to find and invest in programs that are meeting a unique and critical need in our community. From homeless veterans to individuals who are HIV+, we carefully direct your donations to effective housing programs serving our community's most vulnerable neighbors.

Jade's Story

21-year-old Jade entered the Stopover Transitional Living program after being honorably discharged from the Army after breaking her ankle. She had a long history of family abuse and neglect and felt as though she wouldn't safely return to her home. After entering the program, Jade was placed with a Youth Development Specialist and together they determined that the Job Corps Nursing Assistant program would be a great fit for her.

After she graduated from the program and received her CNA license, she still felt like she needed to gain more skills in order to be able to live independently. She was welcomed back into the program and where she learned the skills needed, built her resume while working at a local nursing home, and saved money for her own place and a car.

Jade is the perfect example of where hard work and commitment can lead, and it was made possible with a grant from the REALTOR* Foundation. She has now decided to continue her pursuit of a career in the healthcare field and has enrolled in college for next semester.





Back on His Feet

Wes first used drugs at age 7. By 14, he was addicted. Almost immediately he began doing whatever he had to do to get his next high, whether it was breaking into homes or stealing from family and friends. Eventually he was caught and landed in boy's school, but that was only the beginning. Wes ultimately had to be revived from 5 separate overdoses.

This was his life. Until June 2016, when he arrived at Pathway to Recovery beaten and broken.

Today, at barely 30 years old, Wes is back on his feet. You see, recovery is often a long and sometimes never-ending road. The success at which is equal parts the readiness and willingness to get help and finding the right help. Not only did Wes commit himself to the recovery tools offered at Pathway's long term transitional living program, he also joined Pathway's partner organization "Back on My Feet"— whose mission is to combat homelessness through the power of running, community support and essential employment and housing resources.

Wes found his passion and was introduced to a gift he never knew he had—running! Since Wes began running, he has competed in and completed 30 races, one of which was a 24hr 200-mile relay race through horse country in Kentucky!

He has won numerous awards for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place and he was the winner of the 2018 New Year's Day Resolution Run in subzero temperatures.


Wes is currently doing an apprenticeship through AmeriCorp's Public Allies program, which is a 10-month long service-oriented program focusing on leadership skills and professionalism with extensive training in social justice.

According to Wes, Pathway and Back on My Feet helped him find a better way of life without drugs. He is back in his 4-year-old daughter's life and they adore each other. Today Wes has something he never had—hope.

They also gave two bedrooms a fresh coat of paint that will brighten up the room and spirits of those staying there. The most significant project included rebuilding a custom fence for the property. The new fence not only adds to the security of the property and those who are recovering from hospitalization and homelessness, but it adds to the beautification of the neighborhood.






